We are excited to announce that our inaugural conference will take place in person, at Harvard University on **Friday–Saturday, April 8–9, 2022**.

The keynote address is to be delivered by [Pratap Bhanu Mehta](#) (Centre for Policy Research, New Delhi; Laurance S. Rockefeller Distinguished Professor at the Center for Human Values, Princeton University), a founding advisor of the Association for Global Political Thought.

We welcome submissions that seek to enrich the study of political, social, and international thought; expand the scopes of political traditions and their languages; interrogate the discipline's constitutive exclusions and limits of existing methods of inquiry; or address the theoretical and historical foundations of contemporary global political predicaments.

**Length:** Papers must not exceed 10,000 words, including citations.

**Formatting:** Submissions, in either PDF or MS word documents, should be formatted consistently and for blind review. We suggest 12-pt font and double-spacing. Notes and bibliography may be in any style but must be consistent.

**Funding:** Thanks to generous funding from the Edmond J. Safra Center for Ethics, the Harvard University Department of Government, as well as a host of associated institutions, we will provide funding to defray costs for transportation and lodging.
