Genetic Genealogy as a Window into Genomic Science: Racial Boundary Blurring and Reification

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Design: We plan four short vignettes that will specify hypothetical individuals of various racial and ethnic backgrounds who have submitted their DNA for genealogical testing. The vignette will provide the test's "results," manipulating them as explained below. Respondents are then asked to react to the posited results. The four questions, the three response categories, and the positive or negative pole within each response category will be randomly ordered. The gender of the hypothetical person will match that of the respondent. The race of the hypothetical person will match that of the respondent for questions 1 and 2, but will differ from that of the respondent for questions 3 and 4. (For purposes of this survey experiment, we will treat black, white, Hispanic, Asian American, and multiracial as mutually exclusive and conceptually identical "races.")

We are requesting that the respondent see a map of the world while answering all of the questions, with each continent a different color and country boundaries visible but no country names included. Examples are:

We request equal sized samples of self-identified non-Hispanic Blacks, Latinos, Asian Americans, non-Hispanic Whites, and multi-racials, from a national population of adults over age 18. With 200 in each of five groups, and with each respondent receiving twelve questions, that totals 12,000 respondent-questions. Please let us know the additional charge beyond what TESS normally permits (8000 respondent-questions.)

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If possible, we would like to add a larger sample size to each of the five categories of respondents. Please let us know how much these additions would cost, so that we can decide if it is feasible. We would also appreciate a conversation with TESS or KN about the feasibility and cost of permitting the Hispanic sample to be interviewed in either English or Spanish, as the respondent wishes.

Sample: 1000 respondents [divided equally into self-identified non-Hispanic Blacks, Latinos, Asian Americans, non-Hispanic Whites, and multi-racials] x 4 items, each with 3 responses = 12,000 respondent-items.

Additional profile items:

- 1) 2008 presidential candidate voted for
- 2) ancestry
- 3) US citizenship
- 4) attitudes about technology and new technology products
- If African American, use Africa.
- If White, use Europe or the Middle East.
- If Hispanic, use Latin America or Spain.
- If Asian American, use Asia.
- If 2+ races, use 2 continents, randomly chosen.

Show map with the continents distinctly identified in separate colors.

3 forms of randomization: 1) among the 4 questions; 2) among the 3 response categories; 3) between the positive and negative pole, or "matter a lot/not matter at all" within each response category.

For the responses under A. for each question, we request a 7 point scale with labels – that is, tick boxes labeled "completely xx; mostly xx; somewhat xx; neither xx or not xx (as in, "neither pleased nor displeased"), somewhat not xx, mostly not xx, completely not xx" (with appropriate modifications to fit the responses). We do not want to include a tick box for "no opinion." If the respondent does not complete the item on the screen, we ask KN for a prompt to encourage him/her to do so – but if the respondent still does not answer, then the next screen should appear, with "NA" as the coded response.

If possible, it would be valuable to have a location on the screen where the respondent can enter a volunteered or open-ended response to any of the questions.
