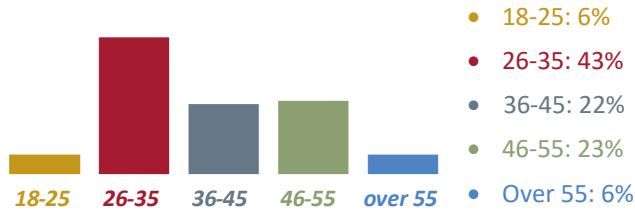

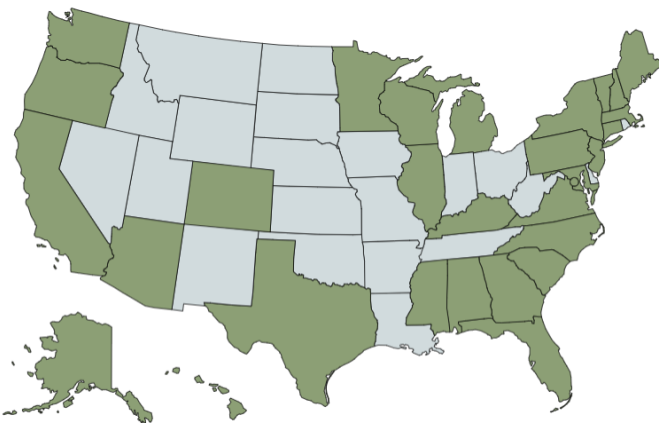

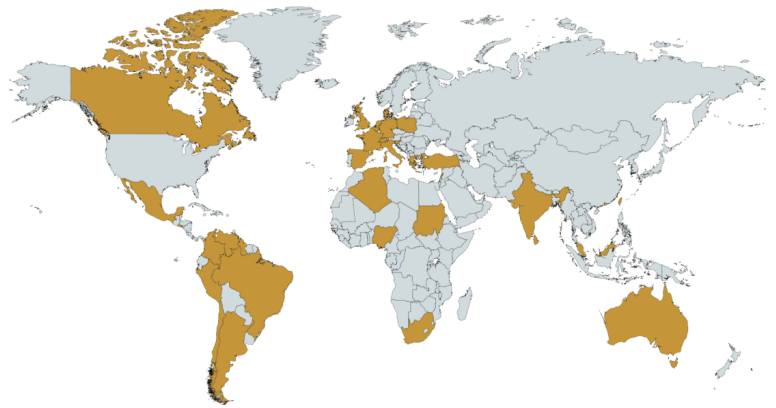

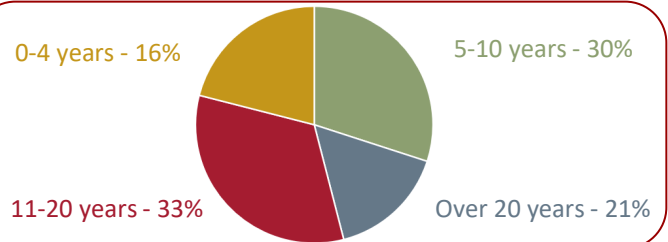
Employment

87% were employed full-time while pursuing a certificate.

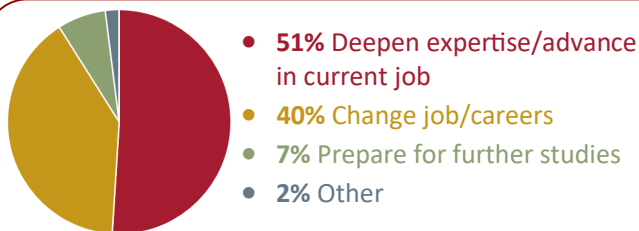
54% report that simply completing coursework toward their certificate contributed to career benefits, including:

- Career change

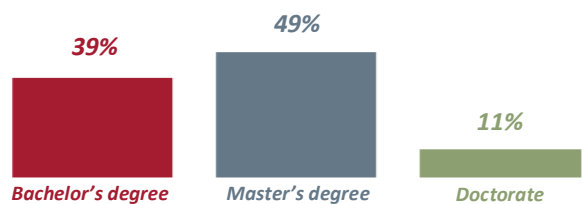
Years of full-time work experience

Select job titles held by our certificate earners



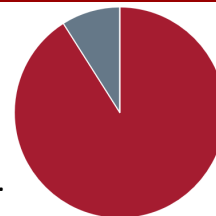
96% of recent certificate earners would recommend a Harvard Extension School certificate.
